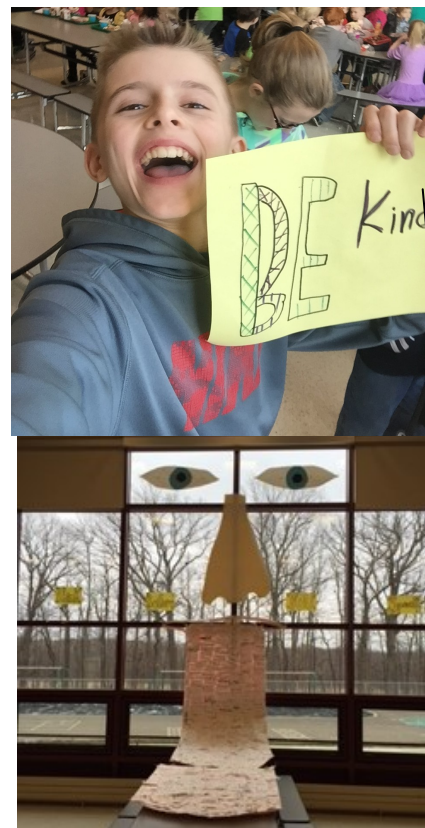
In the cafeteria CESA members constructed a large face

Preschool Peer Modeling Screening

Peer model screening for 2016-17 preschool students will take place Friday, March 18, 2016 at Cloverleaf Elementary School. Morning session 9:30am-11:30am and afternoon session 12:30pm-2:30pm. Students participating in screening will participate in a “mock” preschool day including free play, art, story time, music and movement, snack, restroom, and direct assessments with classroom teachers.

A typical peer model must:

- Possess strong social and communication skills
- Be at least 4 years old by Oct. 1 the year of attendance
- Be able to follow directions and attend to tasks for five to seven minutes
- Be secure in beginning pre-academic skills (counting, colors, name recognition, etc.)



The Cloverleaf preschool program runs Monday through Thursday with morning (9-11:45am) and afternoon sessions (1-3:40pm). Students must attend all four days (Monday through Thursday). The first day of preschool for the 2016-17 school year is Monday, August 29th, and runs in accordance with the elementary school calendar. Tuition is \$110.00 per month from September through May. Interested parents should call the CES office at 330-302-0103 to register their child for a session (AM 9:30-11:30 or PM 12:30-2:30).
