**Mix It Up at Lunch Day**

A national campaign launched by Teaching Tolerance in 2002, Mix It Up at Lunch Day encourages students to identify, question and cross social boundaries. In national surveys given by The Southern Poverty Law Center, students have identified the cafeteria as the place where divisions are most clearly drawn. So for just a day, we asked students to move out of their comfort zones and connect with someone new over lunch. It's a simple act with profound implications. Studies have shown that interactions across group lines can help reduce prejudice. When students interact with those who are different from them, biases and misperceptions can fall away. Students were given a number and were asked to sit at the table with that number. Students were then given conversation starters on paper to help them to begin socializing with others they don't know very well. Even our teachers joined in the fun! Thank you to everyone who participated.



**Art in Mrs. Fruit's Room**

In Mrs. Fruits art class, 1st grade read the book "I Ain't Gonna Paint No More" and learned not to paint their body, but drew body parts and painted those! Students learned paint skills and observation drawing.

In Mrs. Fruits art class, 3rd grade learn observation drawing and drew a wolf howling at the moon. Students learn the vocabulary term contrast and value by creating a value scale with watercolor in the background.

In Mrs. Fruits art class, 5th grade challenged themselves by mixing a 12 section color wheel with paint only using the 3 primary colors. Students then drew an object on them, cut them out and glued them down in order.
