MEDINA COUNTY SPECIAL OLYMPICS

Special Olympics contributes to the physical, social, and psychological development of the athletes. Through successful experiences in sports, they gain confidence and build a positive self-image which carries over into the classroom, home, work and community. The concept of Special Olympics began in the early 1960's when Eunice Kennedy Shriver started a day camp for individuals with intellectual disabilities. Today, there are Special Olympics programs in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and 150 different countries around the world. Special Olympics Ohio, Inc. is the sole organization accredited by Special Olympics International to conduct programs in Ohio. There are over 200 local member organizations and over 17,500 athletes.

To be eligible for Special Olympics an athlete must:

- have a developmental disability
- be eight years of age or older
- have a valid physical examination and information release form on file
- be a member of an accredited local Special Olympics organization.

Special Olympics Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities is an accredited organization. Special Olympics Medina County offers unified sports, an opportunity for athletes and volunteers to compete side-by-side in team competitions. There are also several demonstration (or experimental) sports available.

Medication End of Year Pick Up

All medication kept at school must be picked up by the last day of school. Students are not permitted to transport medications home. Any medication remaining at school after the last student day will be disposed of properly. Medication is not allowed to be stored in the school's clinic during the summer break. This includes all prescription and non-prescription medications. The only exceptions to this will be inhalers and epipens. These two medications are covered by state law as self-carrying, BUT permission must be given to the school. If you have any questions or concerns, please call the school and ask to speak with the nurse.

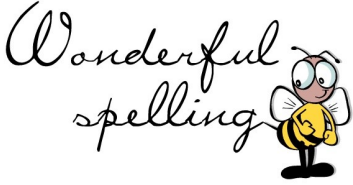
