Final Research Paper & Presentation

Your final assessment for this course will be a combination of a research paper and presentation. You will write a 3-5 page research paper on a topic of your choice that has been covered in this course. You will be required to utilize a minimum of **FOUR** sources. Of those four sources you may only use the Internet for **PRIMARY SOURCES**. You will have to read books. You will give your class presentation during the last two weeks of the trimester selected by random draw.

Paper Requirements

- Paper topic must be approved by Mr. Flint.
- Must be no less than three and no more than five pages in length. Title page and bibliography DO NOT count toward page count total.
- Must utilize footnote citation method as outlined by the Chicago Manual of Style.

- Must include a bibliography.
- Utilize a minimum of <u>FOUR</u> sources. Of those four sources you may only use the Internet for <u>PRIMARY SOURCES</u>.
- Final paper must be submitted electronically *no later than* 12:01 AM, November 2, 2012. A paper copy is due that day in class.
- Failure to follow any of the above requirements will result in an automatic grade of 'F'.
- Plagiarism of any degree will result in a score of zero and three after school detentions.

Presentation Requirements

For the presentation portion of this assignment, you are encouraged to be creative and avoid the monotonous trap of Power Points! Be creative yet scholarly!

- Presentation must be on the same topic as your research paper.
- You must present the class with a <u>ONE</u> page summation of your research paper.
- Multimedia is acceptable but must be tested and verified that it works **BEFORE** the day of your presentation.
- Your presentation <u>CAN NOT</u> be a PowerPoint or Smart Notebook presentation.
- Your presentation <u>CAN NOT</u> make use of a cross-word or word search.
- Your presentation must be <u>no less than 10 minutes and no more than 15 minutes</u> in length. Points will be deducted for going over or under the allotted time.
- Food <u>CAN NOT</u> be a part of your presentation unless it is authentic medieval-Renaissance Era cuisine using <u>ONLY</u> ingredients and preparation methods of that time period.
