### POST HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT

Class of 2020 – 44.15% attended 4 year colleges and universities, 14.36% attended community colleges or technical schools, 38.30% plan to work, and 3.19% attended military.

### HONOR/MERIT ROLL

Students who receive a grade point average of 3.5 or higher, for each semester, are Honor Roll students. Students who receive a grade point average of 3.0 to 3.499, for each semester, are Merit Roll students.

### CCP COURSES

In 2020-2021 a total of 68 students participated in full/part-time College Credit Plus enrollment options and earned a total of 799 credits.

### DISCIPLINARY REPORTING POLICY

Cloverleaf High School does not share disciplinary records with post-secondary institutions. Students will provide answers regarding their disciplinary history on their college application.

### EDUCATING DURING COVID

In response to the State of Ohio’s closure of schools, which went into effect March 17, 2020, Cloverleaf High School immediately created and executed a plan for the continuity of instruction. In this plan, students were expected to continue all of their coursework in an established learning management system (Google Classroom) designed and managed remotely by their teachers. Students continued to learn remotely on school-issued Chromebooks until the end of the school year which occurred on May 28, 2020.

### CLASS OF 2020

Because of the unusual circumstances surrounding the sudden closing of schools in the state of Ohio, our school board determined that students would be held harmless for the last (4th) quarter of the 2019-2020 school year (a period of 9 weeks). Students had an option to receive grades of O, S, U (Outstanding, Satisfactory, Unsatisfactory) or a traditional letter grade for the quarter. Final grades for students opting for the O, S, U option were determined using grades up through the end of the third quarter. Final grades for students opting for a traditional grade were calculated using all quarter and exam grades up through the end of the school year.

### CLASS OF 2021 and beyond

The Class of 2021 were given the option of two instructional formats for the 2020-2021 school year: Option 1 was a hybrid format provided by our teachers (a blend of in-person virtual, and remote learning); Option 2 was a 100% online format in which the curriculum was provided by an outside vendor of course software.
